### Center for Technology in Government Appoints J. Ramon Gil-Garcia as Research Director

The Center for Technology in Government (CTG), University at Albany-SUNY has named Dr. J. Ramon Gil-Garcia as its research director, following an international search that attracted top candidates in the field of digital government research and practice.



Dr. Gil-Garcia has served as associate professor for the Division of Public Administration and the director of the Data Center for Applied Research in Social Sciences at Centro de Investigación y Docencia Económicas (CIDE) in Mexico City since 2007. He is author of the 2012 book, *Enacting Electronic Government Success: An Integrative Study of Government-wide Websites, Organizational Capabilities, and Institutions*.

“Dr. Gil-Garcia is one of the leading scholars in his field with a strong record of external funding and demonstrated leadership who will continue to expand CTG’s global leadership position in digital government research and practice,” said Theresa Pardo, CTG Director. “I am delighted that we have attracted such an accomplished scholar and researcher to CTG.”

### About J. Ramon Gil-Garcia

Dr. Gil-Garcia is a member of the National System of Researchers in Mexico and the Mexican National Academy of Sciences. He is a former Fulbright Scholar and Digital Government Fellow with the Harvard Kennedy School of Government, and is currently a Faculty Affiliate at the National Center for Digital Government, University of Massachusetts Amherst. Dr. Gil-Garcia has been an adjunct professor in the Rockefeller College of Public Affairs and Policy, the Department of Management Science and Information Systems at the School of Business, and the School of Information Science and Policy at UAlbany, and a Post-Doctoral Fellow and a Research Fellow at CTG. He has been a lecturer for bachelors, masters, and doctoral programs in Mexico and a few other countries around the world.

In 2009, Dr. Gil-Garcia was identified as the most prolific author in the field of digital government research worldwide. Some of his publications are among the most cited in the field of digital government. He is the author or co-author of articles in *The International Public Management Journal*, *Government Information Quarterly*, *Journal of the American Society for Information Science and Technology*, *European Journal of Information Systems*, *Journal of Government Information*, *International Journal of Electronic Government Research*, *Public Finance and Management*, *International Journal of Cases on Electronic Commerce*, *International Journal of Electronic Governance*, *International Journal on Computers, Systems and Signals*, *Reforma y Democracia*, *Gestión y Política Pública*, *Convergencia*, *Ciencia Ergo Sum*, and *Espacios Públicos*, among other prestigious journals.

Dr. Gil-Garcia's research has been funded by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC) of Canada, and the National Council for Science and Technology (CONACYT) in Mexico, and he has participated in many projects funded by the U.S. National Science Foundation (NSF). His research interests include collaborative electronic government, inter-organizational information integration, smart cities and smart governments, adoption and implementation of emergent technologies, information technologies and organizations, digital divide policies, new public management, public policy evaluation, and multi-method research approaches. Within the next few months, he will become the Editor of the journal *Gestión y Política Pública*, which is one of the only two public administration journals in Spanish that are included in the Social Science Citation Index.

Prior to his academic positions, he worked as a systems analyst and the director's executive assistant at the General Direction of Rural Development, Secretary of Agricultural Development of the State of Mexico. Dr. Gil-Garcia also has experience as a consultant for federal, state, and local public organizations. He has been a volunteer in several non-profit organizations and is an active member of professional associations in fields such as Public Administration, Information Systems, and Political Science.
