CTG Holds Workshop for USDA Forest Service's Electronic Commons Grant Program

The USDA Forest Service's "Leveraging Investments in the Electronic Commons Project" is designed to encourage the utilization of advanced communication technologies to share information and solutions on topics of concern to national forests and their neighboring communities. Consistent with their commitment to knowledge and information sharing the USDA is also working with the Center for Technology in Government to document the lessons learned by the eight project teams funded by the program.

On November 9 and 10, CTG hosted a reflection workshop designed to bring together the project participants and to engage them in discussions about experiences and lessons learned. A lessons learned report including project summaries is scheduled for release to the USDA Forest Service and other relevant communities in early spring.
