#### **Building a Sustainable International Digital Government Research Community**

The goal of this four-year effort is to create a framework for a sustainable global community of practice among digital government (DG) researchers and research sponsors. CTG recently completed one of the key objectives of this project, a reconnaissance study ([http://www.ctg.albany.edu/publications/reports/recon\\_study](http://www.ctg.albany.edu/publications/reports/recon_study)), which takes a broad look at the current state of international DG research to identify its main contours and current directions. This report provides a baseline against which to measure the future development of internationally-oriented DG research.
